**Object Description**: Brocaded fragment, curved seams joining eight separate pieces; salmon ground with liseré<sup>1</sup> and multi-colored brocaded elements; brocaded flower & leaf spray repeat housed in adjoining, undulating, brocaded pearl roundel/ogee with interstitial brocaded flower.

**Date or period of object**: mid-18<sup>th</sup> century; Liseré and brocading wefts were two techniques most used in figured silks during this period<sup>2</sup>, particularly in Lyonnais textiles.

Place of origin: possibly France


Maker/Culture: possibly Lyonnais

**Function**: possibly formerly part of a garment, as indicated by seam construction

**Cultural/ Historical Context**: Highly sophisticated, labor intensive construction; costly foundation fabric and silver (?) brocading elements; reflects vogue for brightly colored textiles in this period and intricate craftsmanship of Lyonnais (?) weavers.
